A sizable warehouse/roadhouse was located at "The Forks" prior to 1910. In addition to serving the sheltering needs of the trail, the proprietor, a man named "Eide," operated the site and cut a horse trail for freighting from Takotna.

The natives refer to the site as "The Place of Two Stores." As McGrath's commercial importance grew, and with the establishment of the 1914 Salmon River to McGrath Trail, "The Forks" business stopped.
