STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

The Foot Hills Roadhouses are nationally significant because of their association with the Iditarod National Historic Trail. There were two reported locations (refer to Peterson's 1980 maps) Foot Hills Roadhouse site #1 is located by Besson Slough three miles northwest of Foot Hills Roadhouse site #2. The Foot Hills Roadhouse site #1 operated at the Besson Slough site from 1910 to 1920 when it was relocated to the Roadhouse #2 operated from 1920 to 1932 when it was closed due to lack of business. The Foot Hills Roadhouse was also referred to as Eben's Roadhouse in later years. The site is locally significant due to its location at the hub of the local trail system which runs along the beach to Shaktoolik and another trail which runs north and joins the cutoff trail between Ungalik and Shaktoolik.
